

AN UPDATE ON THE CHARLES SIMEON INSTITUTE

The Rev'd Canon Dr. Michael W. Petty, Canon for Discipleship & Director of the Charles Simeon Institute

Our Charles Simeon Institute is working to form future lay and ordained leaders for the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA). This past summer we awarded fellowships to three seminary students to enable them to serve a 10-week internship here at the cathedral. Over the course of the summer, they had an immersive experience of parish ministry, experiencing both its joys and challenges. For the past three years, Fr. Wesley Owens has been involved in our Pastoral Curacy Program which provides seminary graduates space to receive further formation after completing seminary. Our Charles Simeon Lay School of Theology just completed its Advent Semester, and we had 38 people enrolled in two classes.

I am happy to welcome Andrew and Rebecca Beluk to the cathedral. Andrew is the first person to enter our newly created Carol Long Missional Curacy Program. This program allows a recent seminary graduate to have a two-year experience of mentored ministry working with Fr. Bill Krizner, Canon for Missions and Evangelism. Both Andrew and Rebecca are new graduates of Trinity School for Ministry in Ambridge, PA. This program was named to honor the pioneering work of Carol Long who was instrumental in the creation of the Charles Simeon Institute. During his time here, Andrew will begin the process of discernment for Holy Orders and will acquire essential skills for doing ministry in a post-Christian culture.

I want to offer a profound word of thanks to Kathleen Smith who has served as Associate Director of the Charles Simeon Institute for the past five years and who has resigned so she can focus on some other things. Kathleen brought organization and efficiency to our operations, was a source of wise counsel and advice, helped us with donor engagement, and served as a friend and pastor to many summer interns and several curates. I am deeply grateful to Kathleen for her complete dedication to the ministry of the Charles Simeon Institute.

Over the next several months, we will be working to fill the vacancy left by Kathleen and preparing to host some more summer interns.
