INTERNATIONAL MISSIONS Frances Merritt, International Core Captain

Over the past few months, we've been able to host three important leaders from Africa. First, in September, Bishop Nason Baluku, Diocese of South Rwenzori in Uganda, visited us in person before attending the New Wineskins conference alongside many of our parishioners. The Diocese of South Rwenzori in Uganda provided spiritual covering and episcopal oversight for St. Peter's in the early days and continues to be an important ministry partner as Bp. Nason also handles the Orphans and Vulnerable Children tuition assistance program that we support. In November, we were blessed to host Fr. John Chol Daau, one of the 'Lost Boys of Sudan' who escaped genocide and then ultimately led many to know Jesus and currently runs a school in South Sudan. If you haven't read Fr. John's book, <u>God's Refugee: The Story of a Lost Boy Pastor</u>, I highly recommend you do so. Most recently, we had the pleasure of Archbishop Jackson Ole Sapit of Kenya visiting us and sharing his testimony and examples of how God is working powerfully throughout the dioceses under his purview. He mentioned that he has more than 40 bishops under his leadership as well as around five-million parishioners, a truly awe-inspiring number.

We're also planning and taking steps to be feet on the ground through two upcoming mission trips. First, in June, we have a team that will serve in Nicaragua in conjunction with an organization called Twelve Churches. It is a wonderful organization comprised in part by ten pastors in Nicaragua who together identify needs that mission teams could meet for their churches in the coming year. Then, the skill sets of specific mission teams are matched to meet those needs. We're looking forward to seeing how God uses our team to bless and to be blessed there. In September, our Uganda Mission team plans to travel to the South Rwenzori area of Uganda where we plan to hold seminars for the priests andlLay-leaders, parents and teachers and the students, as well as serving in Prison Ministry and serving through Tarmac, the non-profit set-up by our very own Susan Burton that provides youth ministry through basketball. The common thread with both teams is that we've been in communication with the people on the ground to make sure we meet actual needs rather than perceived needs. Please join us in praying for both trips before, during and after our journeys.

We are still supporting 90 or so students through the Orphans and Vulnerable Children program throughout South Rwenzori in Uganda. We're thankful to report that the students are scheduled to return to school on February 6th after officials ended the last term early due to an Ebola outbreak. We still have several students in need of support for this year so please contact me if you are interested in supporting a student. All it takes is \$125.00 per student for the school year!

Our church provides financial support to Fr. Will and Becky McLaughlin, who, along with their children Liam, Reese and Finn, have arrived in Cambodia in Southeast Asia and for the past six months have been spending most of their time learning Khmer, the local language, and getting to know the ... continued on to page 2 of The Keys
