WHERE TRUE JOYS ARE TO BE FOUND By The Rev'd Canon Dr. Michael W. Petty, Canon for Adult Formation

The following is the preface of this year's Lenten Devotional, WHERE TRUE JOYS ARE TO BE FOUND.

Almighty God, you alone can bring to order the unruly wills and affections of sinners: Grant your people grace to love what you command and desire what you promise; that among the swift and varied changes of this world, our hearts may surely be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** –(Collect for the Fifth Sunday in Lent, BCP, p. 606)

What might it look like for us to become saints? Some may think this a stupid question on the assumption that becoming saints is an impossibility for us. But this assumption ignores the fact that God has in fact called us to holiness. Paul addresses the troubled house churches in Corinth in a way that reminds them of this fact: "To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints" (1 Corinthians 1:2). Answering the question of what it might look like for us to become saints is difficult for two principal reasons. First, because our sin looms so large over our lives that it is difficult to imagine life without it. Second, because it is easy for us to become accustomed to our sin and to make our peace with it ("this is just the way I am"). One of the purposes of Lent is to call both of these into question.

The Collect for the Fifth Sunday in Lent helps us to begin answering the question of what might becoming saints look like for us. To become a saint is to begin to love what God commands and to desire what he promises. Holiness involves not merely being obedient to what God commands but actually coming to love what he commands because we love God. The Christian life is not a path of grim obedience to God's commands where outward conformity hides a coldness of heart. Instead, God leads us to an ever-greater love of what he commands and as we follow in this way, we recognize that we find true freedom and joy in it. Saints are marked not by grim determination but by joyful commitment.

Likewise, being a saint involves not simply accepting what God promises but actually desiring what God promises. Saints are people who have come to desire what God desires. What might our lives be like if we truly desired what God promises us? What might the Church be like if we truly desired what God promises us? Over the course of this Lent, I invite you to think about what it might look like for you to become a saint and to take seriously that this is precisely what God is calling you to.
