

## CARE MINISTRIES OF ST. PETER'S

So, how did Ms. Alice end up working in Care Ministries? What is Care Ministries anyway? The answer to the first question is that Fr. Marcus asked, and I happily agreed to take on this new role as Care Ministries Coordinator. Care Ministries is what we now call Pastoral Care at St. Peter's and being the coordinator just means that I make sure that parishioners are aware of the ministries available to them and can offer them these resources when they are in need.

Vital care ministries are already in place with the Stephen Ministry, Lay Eucharistic Minister-Visitors (LEMVs), the Meal Ministry, and Parish Visitor's Guild, as well as clergy calls and visits. Paul writes in Romans 12: 4-5(NLT) "*Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ's body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other.*" If we belong to each other, we should care for one another. Here are some ways we do this:

- THE STEPHEN MINISTRY offers support when lay people, who are specially trained to walk with people during challenging seasons of life, offer Christian care within a confidential setting. Having benefited from the Stephen Ministry I would highly recommend it to anyone going through one of life's challenges.

- THE MEAL MINISTRY has been revived and Jane Flynn is making delicious homemade meals to take to families with new babies and others in need.
