

TECHNICAL DIFFICULTIES...

First, we apologize for the lack of live-stream of our Sunday worship services last Sunday. We realize that some of you rely on this technology to worship with us due to various circumstances and we are grateful for that!

Second, this interruption of our live-stream service was beyond our control. Without going into great detail, a piece of equipment which serves as the hub of all our other equipment suffered a power supply failure (i.e., the unit itself blew, not a simply power outage). Despite the remaining 100+ pieces of equipment in our system functioning correctly, this single piece of equipment is a lynchpin for not only streaming, but our in-house CCTV. We have not had a backup on hand because 1. they are quite expensive and we seek to be good stewards of our resources, only acquiring what we truly need, and 2. this piece of equipment has been backordered since the beginnings of the Covid-19 pandemic. That being said, we were able to secure an adequate replacement this week—thanks be to God!

Third, we do not anticipate ceasing live-stream operations altogether, but we do hope that as we move beyond the pandemic, all of you will worship with us in-person at the Cathedral and our live-stream will only serve to complement our in-person worship, not replace it.

COMMUNION UPDATES

According to the CDC guidelines, Leon County is now considered an area of low Covid-19 transmission. Because of that, we are now able to reintroduce the 'Common Cup' as an option for receiving the Blood of Christ at Holy Communion on Sunday mornings.

Additionally, we are no longer requiring that masks be worn in the South Transept, but we will continue to require masks be worn in the North Transept for anyone who wishes to only be around others who are masked.

This should be exciting news for us all as we have toiled through these now 2+ years of the Covid-19 pandemic. Slowly, we have returned to a 'normal' pattern of worship, but we have done so with much prayer and through seeking counsel from medical experts.

When you come forward to the altar rail, here are your options:

- **RECEIVE THE WINE BY INTINCTION.** If you don't wish to drink from the cup, but still would like to receive the wine, simply hold onto your wafer and the LEM with the intinction cup will come to you so you may dip your wafer into the wine.
- **RECEIVE THE WINE BY DRINKING FROM THE CUP.** If you'd like to drink from the cup, simply consume the wafer and stay at the rail. When the LEM with the common cup gets to you, they will know that you'd like to drink from the cup.
- **RECEIVE THE BREAD ONLY.** As has always been an option, you may receive the wafer only, if you choose. Simply eat the wafer and either cross your arms over your chest so the Lay Eucharistic Ministers (LEM) pass you by, or return to your pew after receiving the wafer.
- **RECEIVE A BLESSING FROM THE PRIEST.** Simply cross your arms over your chest and the priest will pray a blessing over you.
