We are so excited to share with you that the Lord has provided an incredible new opportunity for our parish to share the light of Christ with our neighbors during the very darkest of days. We all know too well the destruction that is left in the wake of a storm and that's why, through partnership with the Anglican Relief and Development Fund, we are taking specific steps to prepare to respond with God's love during and after catastrophes.

Immediately after the 9AM service this morning, we will have the great privilege of blessing a brand-new St. Peter's trailer that has been set up on the lawn and will be stocked with supplies, cots, and tools to properly respond to disasters throughout the Southeast. We are grateful to be part of a beautiful matching program with ARDF that will now allow this blessed tool to be used by our parish and the diocese to love our neighbors in wonderful new ways. While the disaster response is our first focus, we also have begun praying about opportunities to regularly love our neighbors within our community who may need a helping hand. The opportunity to help with an immediate need provides temporary relief but sharing the Gospel as we go will change lives forever.

This is where you come in. Thank the Lord we have a small army of people in this parish that answer the call when they're needed. We've already seen many of you run into the storm to help our neighbors, but my prayer is to now properly identify others who are willing and able to use their talents when the time comes. We want to host an interest meeting in the near future to form such teams so that the response can be effective when the needs arise. PLEASE COME TO THE TRAILER IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE SERVICE FOR THE BLESSING NOT ONLY SO THAT YOU CAN SEE THE TOOLS THAT THE LORD HAS PROVIDED BUT TO SIGN UP FOR THE INTEREST MEETING TO LEARN MORE ABOUT BEING PART OF THIS IMPORTANT WORK.

We also want to extend a very special thank you to Tommy Lamb from Anglican Relief and Development Fund who is visiting with us for today's trailer blessing, as well as our very own Jim Barnidge who is our Gulf Atlantic Diocese ARDF Representative. They, along with many others throughout the Province, have worked tirelessly to bring forth this impactful ministry and we are grateful to them for their work that now allows St. Peter's to be a beacon of Christ's love to the entire region.

We look forward to seeing you outside but also know that we will be sending out an email to the full parish to ask for everyone to attend the coming interest meeting. Remember, just attending a meeting doesn't commit you to anything. You can help by just sharing your knowledge with the those who are able to go. Prayerfully consider being one of the carpenters, painters, and other skilled tradespersons that can teach others to go in His name. 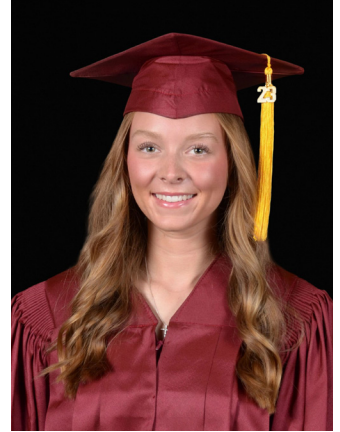

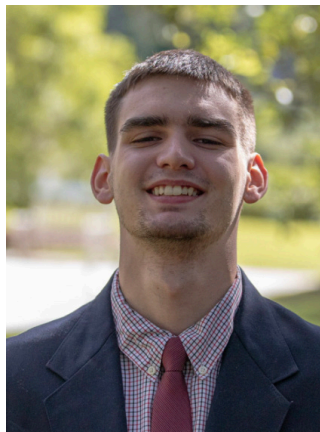
