## CARE MINISTRIES: HEALING THE WOUNDS OF TRAUMA | A WEEKEND RETREAT

Some experiences in life are so painful they cause deep and lasting suffering. That suffering is what we call trauma. Trauma is a deep wound of the heart and mind that takes a long time to heal. It hurts every part of us and our relationships, our bodies, our thoughts, and our faith. In addition to providing lessons that lead people on a journey of healing, the Healing the Wounds of Trauma Retreat forms a small group that creates a space for real conversations about heart wounds, the purpose of lament, and the nature of spiritual flourishing in a broken world. The weekend will be Friday evening 29 July, all day Saturday, 30 July, and Sunday afternoon 31 July. #### UNDER-RESOURCED: SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE

The Daughters of the Holy Cross Summer 2022 Discernment Class is organizing a School Supply Drive for the Refugee community here in Tallahassee. As you may have recently read in the Keys and heard from fellow parishioner Michelle Ubben, St. Peter's has adopted a Refugee family and is partnering with International Rescue Committee (IRC) to help support the current and projected Refugees in and coming to our community.
