Our congregation has a group of commissioned lay people, skilled in caring for those facing challenges in their lives. These people, called Stephen Ministers, have undertaken extensive training to develop and nurture their caring gifts. The care they give is confidential, distinctly Christian, and free of charge.



Care receivers may be hospitalized, grieving the death of

a loved one, separated or divorcing, homebound, unemployed, adjusting to the birth of a child, or experiencing any of the other many difficulties of life.

Think about your life and the lives of the people around you. Are you, or is someone you know, going through a time of crisis? The care of a Stephen Minister may be exactly what's needed to help bring Christ's healing.

## PARTNERED EVANGELISM: HALLELUJAH NIGHT!




