

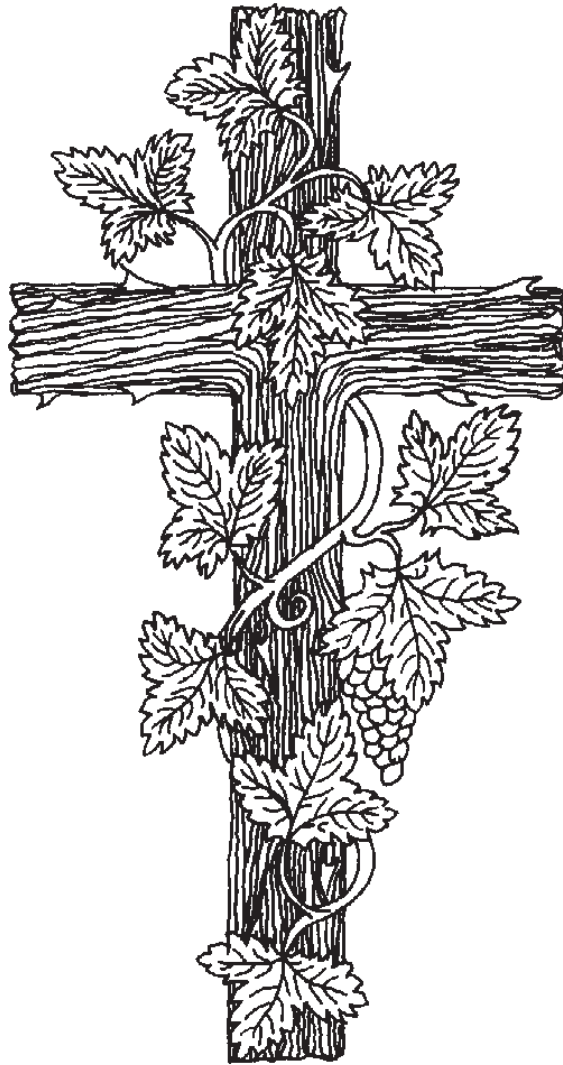

## ST. PETER'S ANGLICAN CATHEDRAL

*Reaching One Another, Tallahassee, and the World with the Transforming Love of Jesus Christ*





We warmly welcome you to St. Peter's Cathedral on this Easter Day as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

This celebration is the highest point of the Church year because Jesus' resurrection is the foundation on which the Christian faith is built. Unlike other faiths, Christianity centers on an objective, historical event: that Christ was "delivered up for our trespasses, and was raised for our justification (Romans 4:25)."

St. Paul puts it this way in his First Letter to the Corinthians: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain...and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins (1 Cor. 15).

The Good News we celebrate today, is that Christ indeed **has been** raised from the dead! Jesus' resurrection not only validated His claim to be God Incarnate and the Messiah of Israel, but it is also a sure and certain sign that Jesus has defeated all of the spiritual forces of evil that stand against us: sin, the devil, and even death itself.

As Anglicans, our pattern of worship is shaped both by Scripture as well as the tradition of the Church through the centuries, specifically the Christianity that has been handed down through the Church of England (Anglo meaning "of or pertaining to England").

This means that our worship is Biblical, liturgical, and sacramental: the focus of our worship being Jesus Christ proclaimed from the Scriptures, and encountered under the signs and symbols of bread and wine at the Holy Eucharist. Today that worship is accompanied by all of the pomp and fanfare befitting the celebration of God's great victory over sin and death.

We hope that you experience the goodness of God, and the joy of Jesus' resurrection as you worship here in this Cathedral Church today!



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**

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*All baptized Christians, regardless of denomination, are welcome to receive the real and living presence of Christ in this Holy Communion. Anyone may come forward for a blessing in lieu of Communion.  
Please indicate your desire for a blessing by crossing your arms on your chest.*

*An usher will release the aisles to come forward for Communion. A verger will direct you to the altar rail. A priest will place a wafer in your hands when you come forward. If you would like to intinct the bread yourself, hold it so it is visible and the first chalice bearer will offer you the intinction chalice for you to dip it in.  
If you would like to drink from the common cup, consume the bread and drink from the chalice offered by the second chalice bearer.*

*Gluten-free wafers are available from the acolytes in front of the pulpit or the lectern. Once you have obtained your wafer, come to the Priest for words of administration.*

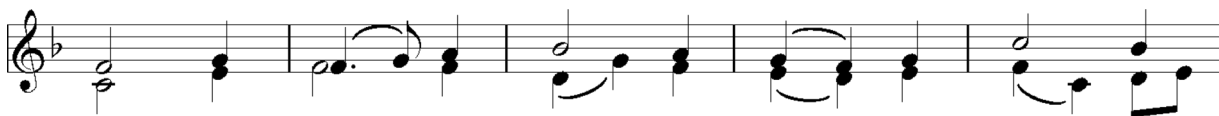


