
UGANDA MISSION IN SEPTEMBER

Planning in earnest has begun for our upcoming mission trip to Uganda in September. Patty Lang, Beth Medley, and I have taken on planning the technical details of the trip and we have a wonderful mission team that has begun meeting once a month to prepare and pray together.

While God's plan for our trip will certainly prevail, our tentative plans are to hold three 1-day seminars in three different areas of the South Rwenzori Diocese of Uganda: Bwera Archdeaconry, Kisinga Archdeaconry, and St. Paul's Deanery. We plan to have three different concurrently run sessions: a presentation on "A Call to Servant Leadership" geared towards the priests and lay leaders, a presentation on "Living a Model/Exemplary Life" geared towards parents and teachers, and a presentation about the dangers of drug addiction & the importance of being grounded in the Word of God, geared toward students.

We also plan to have service days where we will divide our team between serving in Prison Ministry and serving the youth through Tarmac, the non-profit set-up by our very own Susan Burton that provides youth ministry through basketball. We're fortunate to have both Bobby Carrouth and Larry Gonzalez as team members with vast prison ministry experience, and we're excited to see how God uses our entire team to bless the prisoners we will encounter. As for Tarmac, thanks to the generous support of many from our church and fellow community members, enough money has been raised by Tarmac to build an outdoor basketball court in Uganda that will hopefully be completed before our visit. If it is completed as planned, our team will be able to work with the local youth on that court and connect with them through basketball ministry.

We will also have time to spend in worship and fellowship with many of our fellow Anglicans there, which will be especially rewarding given the support shown by the South Rwenzori Diocese towards our church in its early days.

Our team has also been working together to raise funds for this trip, as you may have seen through the Sausage Dog fundraisers and the recent Shrove Tuesday Dinner, which are fundraisers for both our team and the Nicaragua mission team. We are grateful for the wonderful support and encouragement of so many of you.

We specifically ask that you join us in praying for the health and safety of the entire team before, during, and after our trip. We also ask that you pray that God continues to guide us in the details of this trip so that we accomplish His will and provide the financial support we will need to carry it all out.
