

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

Portions of this text are taken from 'Concerning the Great Vigil Easter' in the Book of Common Prayer, 2019

Welcome to St. Peter's! Whether this is your first worship service here, or you've lost count, we're so glad you're here to celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead. We are an Anglican Church and the Cathedral of the Gulf Atlantic Diocese of the Anglican Church in North America. As such, we are rooted in the theology and worship of the English Reformation and our service consists of a regular pattern of prayers, music/songs, and readings. The Great Vigil, when observed, is the first liturgy of Easter Day. It is celebrated at a convenient time between sunset on Holy Saturday and sunrise on Easter morning. It is appropriate that the service begin in darkness.

The liturgy consists of four main parts:

THE SERVICE OF LIGHT: a new fire is kindled, and from it the Paschal Candle is lit, symbolizing Christ, the light of the world. The Exsultet, an ancient song of praise, is sung or said as the climax of this part of the liturgy. According to ancient tradition, the light for the Paschal Candle is taken from newly kindled fire and not from an already existing source of light.

THE SERVICE OF LESSONS: key passages from Scripture recount the history of God's mighty acts and promises. These readings are accompanied by psalms, canticles, and prayers. The Service of Lessons concludes with the Easter Acclamation. After the Easter Acclamation, the joy of the resurrection is appropriately demonstrated by bells and music. The People are invited to ring their keys!

HOLY BAPTISM is the Sacrament through which candidates are united to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ (ROMANS 6:3-4), which the Church celebrates on this most holy night. On this night, we celebrate as NINE CHILDREN are received into the fellowship of the Church through the Sacrament of Baptism!

THE HOLY EUCHARIST is the proper culmination of the Easter Liturgy. As we keep this holy feast, we share the joy of our Savior's triumph and are strengthened by his grace to walk in newness of life.

The liturgy, which follows the ACNA *Book of Common Prayer 2019*, is all in the accompanying Service Bulletin for you to easily follow along & participate. Old & New Testament passages are taken from *The Holy Bible, English Standard Version*; Psalms are taken from the *New Coverdale Psalter*.

Finally, we invite you to return to our Cathedral for worship on Sundays, but of equal importance, to become part of this family of broken people—brothers and sisters saved not by works, but by grace, through the death, resurrection, and ascension of our Savior, Jesus Christ!
