SAYING YES:

Answering the Call of the Lord

Growing up, I was told that I should consider going into the ministry. Really, what this meant was, "Hey kid, we noticed that you're semi-good with people and you like the Bible." My struggle with this calling, however, was the fact that I could not imagine myself taking on that kind of responsibility in the Church. Who was I that I should lead God's people?

In the face of such a daunting task, I am reminded of the call story of Moses. Moses encounters the Lord, the Creator of the universe, in an incredible sign of a burning bush which is not consumed by the flame. The Lord calls Moses to lead His people out of the land of Egypt and gives Him signs that will confirm this calling. Yet Moses still can't see himself leading God's people, and responds to God's calling, "Oh, my Lord, I am not eloquent, either in the past or since you have spoken to your servant, but I am slow of speech and of tongue (Ex. 4:10)." Moses lets the Lord know that He's made an honest mistake. After all, how could a man who is such a poor speaker lead anyone, let alone free them from the bondage of slavery? The Lord responds with a simple question: "Who has made man's mouth... Is it not I, the Lord (Ex. 4:11)?"

Like Moses, I find it hard to believe that I can live up to the Lord's calling on my life. The truth is, I'm afraid to say "Yes" to the Lord because I know my own inadequacies, shortcomings, and disappointments. It seems that, deep down, I believe that my weakness will hinder the work of God. And yet, I can hear God asking me, "Who was it that made you? Was it not I, the Lord?"

This has been the Lord's question to me as I have struggled and pushed myself during my time as a Charles Simeon Fellow. As I put on the collar for the first time at the beginning of the summer, I knew that it would be a long summer as the weight of responsibility began to press on my shoulders. But time and time again, the Lord has proven faithful, saying to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness (1 Cor. 12:8)." Although the summer has been long, I wouldn't trade it for anything in the world because it is here that the Lord has made His calling on my life abundantly clear.


