In the spirit of community, compassion, and the teachings of the Gospel, St. Peter's Anglican Cathedral will host a bed-building event in partnership with SLEEP IN HEAVENLY PEACE. This extraordinary initiative reflects our commitment to embracing the core values of empathy, service, and the love of Christ.

This year's event will be right here at St. Peter's on Saturday, September 30, 2023, from 7:30–11:30am.

As we come together to construct beds for children in need, we draw inspiration from the wisdom of Proverbs 3:27: *"Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to do it."* Our mission is to embody this biblical truth by extending our hands in service and making a tangible impact in the lives of children who require a warm and secure place to rest their heads.

SLEEP IN HEAVENLY PEACE has made it their mission to ensure that no child sleeps on the floor, providing comfort, dignity, and hope. By aligning our efforts with this incredible organization, we are fulfilling the mandate of Matthew 25:40: "*And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'*"

Building 15 bunks (30 beds) takes many hands and whether you are a skilled carpenter or have never picked up a hammer, your presence and willingness to serve are invaluable. In addition to the 50 volunteers needed for the build, we also need five teams of three to deliver and put the beds together afterwards. Our bed-building event is an opportunity to be stewards of God's grace, sharing our gifts to bring joy and peace to those who need it most.
