

Wednesday Choral Evensong

From the earliest days of Christianity, the faithful have sought to fulfill St Paul's exhortation to "pray without ceasing." As the Church spread and developed, this command began to be lived out through eight services of prayer spread throughout the day. They became known as the *Divinum Officium* ("Divine Office/Obligation"), as they were the means by which Christians could fulfill their obligation of daily prayer.

In churches throughout the world, together with the Holy Eucharist, these eight Offices ensured that any time a Christian prayed, he would be joining prayers with the Church the world over, no matter the time of day.

By the late Middle Ages, two of these Offices-Vespers (Evening Prayer) and Compline (Bedtime Prayer)-began to be combined in English churches and cathedrals. Vespers would be delayed, and Compline would be prayed earlier. Together, these two services became known as Evensong, and it was a well-beloved Office indeed throughout Western Europe.

When Archbishop Cranmer began to formulate the first Book of Common Prayer (published in 1549), he officially combined Vespers and Compline into one Office of Evening Prayer in English. So popular was the name "Evensong," that this first Prayer Book even enshrined the nickname as an official (no pun intended) title, with the Archbishop giving us "An Ordre for Evensong throughout the yeare."

Here at St Peter's, our Wednesday Evensongs (5:30pm) will be offered chorally (i.e., many parts of the Office are sung by the choir on behalf of the congregation), using the text from the 1662 Book of Common Prayer. This practice, taken from the English Cathedral tradition, allows newcomers and seasoned parishioners alike a chance to immerse themselves in the timeless prayer of the Church, to experience the best music of the English Choral tradition and of modern composers, and to find an oasis of prayer in an otherwise hectic world. It also gives St Peter's a chance to train our choristers (our youth and children studying music at the Cathedral) in a life of regular prayer and service.

When you come to Evensong, you are invited to listen, to pray along, and to join in on the conversation of "Official" prayer that has been going on daily in an unbroken line for 2,000 years. This conversation began long before any of us was born, and it will continue after we return to the dust of the earth, even to the end of time.

The texts of Evensong (not just the Lessons) are taken almost entirely from Holy Scripture, and through this pattern of quotation and prayer, we proclaim the works of God throughout history and in the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.
