In the Stewardship pamphlet, there are many photos and few words. Behind each of these is an untold story, a story of God's provision for His church, but also His love for the world through His church.

In the last year, we have celebrated much and accomplished much as well. We launched our first ever Great Commission Pledge to increase our budgeted spending beyond our walls through the Missions & Evangelism ministries, including the Charles Simeon Institute. We had the highest attendance of the Lay School of Theology course we've ever had. Dozens of families participated in our 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Family Bible School. We hosted the Gulf Atlantic Diocese on multiple occasions for Synod, a special Synod to elect our new bishop, and other diocesan events, including the recent consecration of Bishop Alex Farmer. Cathedral Concerts have continued to be a blessing to our community. Prayer Ministry was launched in both Intercessory Prayer Ministry and Healing Prayer Ministry—and we've already seen miracles! In February, over 200 women gathered for a retreat with renowned speaker and author, Susan Alexander Yates. Children's and Youth Ministries have collaborated more than ever to truly be a Family Ministry, training families how to do discipleship in their homes, not just at church. And so much more...

Again, we have much to celebrate! But I believe we're just getting started in how we, as a cathedral parish, can offer ourselves to the Lord as we walk in love—for one another, the broken world around us, and ultimately for our Creator.

I've said it before and I'll say it again—there's no pulling punches, this is stewardship season. Yes, it's about money, but only insofar as the money is about the Kingdom of God and offering Him ourselves just as Jesus offered himself wholly, for us, as a fragrant offering. Our hope is that, like last year, we might continue to approach this season differently as we seek to be good stewards of all God has entrusted to us and all that He is leading us into.

I pray you will be both encouraged and challenged, as I am, by what you see in the pamphlet. It just scratches the surface of all God has done, is doing, and will do through the ministry of St. Peter's.

And I pray that we will all respond simply and only in one way—by walking together as a living sacrifice to our Lord.

## Welcome, Bishop Nason Baluku!

### **ABOUT BISHOP NASON**

The Rt. Rev. Nason Baluku is the third bishop of the Diocese of South Rwenzori. He was consecrated and enthroned as bishop on December 13<sup>th</sup> 2020 at St. Paul's Cathedral, Kasese. He succeeded the Rt. Rev. Jackson Nzerebende, who had been the bishop of the diocese since 2003.

He was born in Mahango Sub-County on the slopes of the Rwenzori mountains in Kasese District. He holds a Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership and Management and a Bachelor of Community Leadership and Development, both from Uganda Christian University (UCU). He received a Diploma in Theology from UCU and a Provincial Certificate in Theological Studies from Bishop Balya Theological College.

He was born again at the age of 12 in 1979 and was confirmed three years later in 1982 by Bishop Kamanyire. By the time he was 17 years old, he was commissioned as a catechist, and later a lay reader. In 1995, he was ordained as a deacon, and then as a priest 1996. He was appointed as a canon of St. Paul's Cathedral in 2005.



Bishop Nason has served in a variety of ministry positions, including a vicar of several parishes, an archdeacon, diocesan secretary, program director for the Bishop Masereka Christian Foundation, PDR coordinator in the Provincial Secretariat, and project manager for the international organization Barnabas Fund. He is married to Jane Biira Baluku and God has blessed them with seven children.



#### ABOUT SOUTH RWENZORI DIOCESE

South Rwenzori Diocese represents the Anglican Church of Uganda in Kasese District. It was carved from Ruwenzori Diocese in 1984 and is now made up of 13 archdeaconries, 84 parishes, and 558+ local congregations. The diocese is located in the Southwest of Uganda and covers the same area as Kasese District. To the south is Lake Edward and to the west is the border with the Democratic Republic of the Congo. We are found in the foothills of the Rwenzori Mountains and the lowlands of the Western Rift Valley. At the foot of the mountains is Kasese Town, the administrative centre for the district.
