

Spiritual Mentorship: An Opportunity To Be Discipled

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled. -Matthew 5:6

Jesus thought so much of the importance of discipleship that he taught it as the centerpiece of His Great Commission and spent His entire ministry personally discipling twelve men. Together with Paul, who Jesus also discipled, these men became the backbone of the early church, and they were just ordinary guys that went through an extraordinary experience.

Discipleship is basically learning better how to walk with Jesus and how to more effectively carry out His call on your life. It is essential during any life stage but can be particularly impactful and critical during the parenting years.

Discipleship training or mentoring involves spending time with a spiritually mature man or woman to benefit from their experience in living out the challenge of our journey with Jesus. Every believer will benefit from and probably find themselves really enjoying this exercise in pursuing Christian maturity and learning how better to apply Scripture to life's issues. This most often takes place by meeting with your mentor once a week for an hour or two to share about God's work in and through your life. Mature mentors care for you but focus their work on helping you better center your life in Christ, allowing you to grow closer to the Lord.

Followers of Christ intrinsically desire to know Jesus more and crave greater intimacy with Him. The purpose of weekly time with a spiritual mentor is to help form you in the Christian life, with an eye toward an ever-increasing understanding and love for the Lord and for His Gospel. A Brother or Sister who mentors you is willing to walk through the process of discipleship—encouraging, pressing, and challenging you in your spiritual walk with Christ. It allows you to experience a depth of Faith that informs and influences decisions that you make in your marriage, as a parent, in your job, and in your daily life.

I personally had the wonderful experience of being discipled by a gifted and godly man named Bob West when I was in my thirties, and it literally changed my life. St. Peters has people willing to meet with anyone who would like to take advantage of this opportunity to grow in their faith journey. CATHEDRAL TOUR

Saturday, 14 October | 10-11am | No doubt many of you have attended numerous services and admired the beauty of the cathedral—have you considered taking a tour? Tours are given on the second Saturday of each month at IOAM.

You can learn about the symbolism of the West end of the building, the architectural details of the spires and crosses, why the construction took 2 years instead of 200, why the older cathedrals took hundreds of years to build, learn about the narthex, why the baptismal font is almost always at the west end, why the floor is supported by the prayers of the people, why the pews are the most expensive wood you will ever sit on, symbolism of the poppyheads on the ends of the pew, symbolism of the nave, roof, and roof support system, how and why Robert Mullins made the crucifix, learn about symbolism of the alter, Pulpit, Tester over the pulpit, and Lecturn, learn about the statues and reredos made by Granda Liturgical in Spain, the stained glass windows made by Wipple Glass in Britain, how the stain glass windows are protected, the stations of the cross, the Cathedral organ and why the pulpit has a trap door. So, consider taking a tour and learning everything you would like to know about your Cathedral.
