

Shining God's Light in the Darkness

Jesus was asked what the most important commandment was, and he said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all you soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and, your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27). Then Jesus was asked, "And who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). Jesus then tells the parable of the Good Samaritan where a person is beaten, robbed, and left half dead. A priest and a Levite see the beaten man and pass him by, but a Samaritan had compassion and provided care for him (Luke 10:29-37).

A lesson from this parable is that we are to be that Good Samaritan. We are to show God's love to the world. We are to be God's hands and feet in this world. We, the Church, are to be the shining light in the darkness of this world—and our world today is full of darkness. Human trafficking is a hidden, dark place throughout the world and here in Tallahassee. Men, women, and especially children are lured into the web of trafficking with promises that are never kept

What can we do as a church? Educate ourselves. Get involved. St. Peter's has several new ministry partners that would love your help! Capital City Youth Services (CCYS) is a shelter and refuge for homeless, runaway, and at-risk youth. Hope Community is another new ministry partner under the Human Trafficking Core. Hope Community is a temporary emergency shelter for homeless families, most of which are moms with young children. Learn to be a mentor with the youth at CCYS and with the moms and dads at Hope Community. Tutoring and reading opportunities are also available with the children and youth at both places, which is a great way to become involved and share the love of Christ with those who are lost and broken. A big part of fighting human trafficking is awareness and prevention. We as a church can do both. We can do it within St. Peter's and in the community. We can pray against human trafficking. Join our prayer team. We meet Mondays in-person at Noon in Room 102 of the Undercroft. We are also asking all of Tallahassee to stop and pray to end human trafficking wherever you are at Noon on Fridays.

Our St. Peter's youth are currently collecting youth clothing and shoes for CCYS. Consider donating new or gently used items. The donation bin is located in the Youth House. Clothing would be a true blessing to the CCYS youth. You can also volunteer to help organize the CCYS clothes closet. Donate travel-size personal items like shampoo, deodorant, etc. Cook meals with the CCYS youth and teach them life skills along the way. Volunteer to answer phones. Chaperone on their field trips. At Hope Community, you can be part of the parent circle the *third Monday of each month from 6:30-7:30pm. October 17th* will be St. Peter's circle day. Be part of a work team as we repair the living spaces at Hope to make this place of temporary shelter more of a home for the moms, dads, and children residing there.

Consider the following Bible verses as you pray for those affected by Human Trafficking:

"Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, for anything that becomes visible is light."—Ephesians 5:11-14
