

Mentoring Opportunities

St. Peter's is partnering with Capital City Youth Services, and Safe Families for Children, to provide extended family-like mentors to the young adults being served by CCYS.

These young adults, aged 18-24, are experiencing homelessness and lacking family support. As St. Peter's members train and engage in coming alongside these youth they will provide the relational support they need to help them become successful in this important stage of their lives.

Young adults in this age group, without a strong family support system, are among the most vulnerable at-risk groups to homelessness, trafficking, incarceration, addiction, early pregnancy, and poor educational and job prospects. One caring adult, speaking into their lives, has been evidenced to make a marked difference in those outcomes.

Since these young adults have marked instances of Adverse Childhood Experiences, developing genuine, trust-based relationships is an important part of their potential for healing. As they have new Positive Relational Experiences new, healthy neuropathways can develop and enhance and strengthen not only their mental health and overall wellness but also their relational and emotional intelligence and intuition and increased executive functioning.

Experiencing the Gospel-fueled community of our St. Peter's church family, and seeing the relationships between the volunteers will hopefully model God's design for providing a spiritual family for those who are lacking an earthly one.

If you would like to join these Circles of Support, reach out to Julie Dombroski. The process is a simple process of background screening and some basic trauma-informed training to prepare you for building relationships.

In addition, the rest of our church community will have opportunities to come alongside this new ministry as we provide social, wellness, and professional and personal development opportunities. CCYS is also looking to create a safe space, as a part of this supported transitional living program, for students to meet in and we can use those with design expertise or who enjoy creating nurturing, homelike environments. Likewise, if you enjoy event planning or fundraising, we can use your support as we create events for both those in residence at CCYS, and those who remain unhoused.

Everyone can do something—and any skill, or capacity to serve—can be part of this effort to provide connection, and community.

The CCYS Transitional Living Program that these youth are a part of is an innovative, and evidence-based program that's the first of its kind in our community. The effort to provide long-term, supported housing vs emergency shelter allows residents to set goals, and build the skills and network they need to "graduate" to independence is one that could be transformational in application to the current housing crisis. The longer-term support allows for healing and growth, many of these young adults are working on their GEDs and are holding their first jobs—while they are building life management skills that will take them forward.



Letter to Change Lives

As a 7-year-old in Mongolia, Jargalmaa (pictured left) described one particular day as "unexpected." After school, her teacher invited her to a church where she received her very first gift! This Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift included, among other fun toys, stationery, and a set of hairclips. Inside, she also found a letter that said, "You are valuable and so loved by God." Jargalmaa cherished this message because her parents and grandparents had never told her that they loved her.

Jargalmaa went on to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program where she especially appreciated the lessons about God as Creator. Later in 10th grade, she accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior. Through her testimony, five of her family members and two close friends also made this life-changing decision.

Now 15 years after receiving her shoebox gift, Jargalmaa, her husband, and two young children (pictured above) have recently moved to a new community where they are ministering to youth in hopes of starting a church.

"I would like to challenge people who are preparing shoebox gifts to also write a letter showing God's love," Jargalmaa said. "What's written there may be very simple, but those simple words could completely change somebody's life."

ST. PETER'S ARTISANS | NEW GALLERY WALL EXHIBIT! | The St. Peter's Artisan Wall features artwork created by inmates at the Gadsden Re-Entry Center in Quincy, Florida. The Gadsden Re-Entry Center is the last stop before the men are returned to life outside. It is one of only 4 re-entry centers in Florida and the only one that is not attached to another facility. Artwork is a form of therapy and expression for the inmates.

Gadsden Re-Entry Center's intention is always to reform the inmates, let them come out of their wrongdoings, and be a valuable part of society. The core programs at the facility are more behavior-therapeutic than a traditional prison. Inmates at Gadsden Re-Entry Center



participate in religious-based services, and community-building projects, and recently started an art ministry. In addition to the therapeutic services offered, the inmates also receive education classes, vocational training, parenting classes, life skills training, and employment coaching.

As you admire the artwork, we invite you to pause and pray for the hands that created it with the Prayer for Prisoners from the Book of Common Prayer that is displayed with the pieces. Most of the artwork that is displayed on the artisan wall is available for purchase with all proceeds going to the re-entry facility. Each piece has a card with a suggested donation on it. If you are interested in purchasing a piece please take the card, fill out the back side of it with your name and what you would like to donate, and put the card in the envelope provided near the elevator.
