THE COST OF CHRISTMAS

December is fully upon us. I asked specifically to write a note for the Keys this week, but not because I wanted to. Rather, I felt like I had to. This is about money. But hopefully it's not.

At the end of the year, most of us feel the pinch of Christmas gift shopping, and it gets exhausting. It adds yet another layer to what may already be a stressful season. We can start to resent it. Decades ago, an economist coined the term "the deadweight loss of Christmas" to describe the waste that arises from people making choices for other people, buying things for them they would never buy for themselves. Deadweight is the value lost to one person that isn't gained by another. I'm no economist, but I have Google and can type in "Christmas economics." Article after article talks about the transactional realities, the boon to retailers and loss to consumers.

I think that's often how we relate to the Church, in transactional terms. What is it we gain from coming, from supporting, from being a part of St. Peter's? What does it cost us? We literally count the cost. Even Jesus warns us about the cost of discipleship, that we must realize what it will cost us to follow him (*see Luke 14:25-33*).

So here we are in this Advent, staring down at Christmas, and feeling the weight of cost. I get it. As an aside, and just to add insult to the injury of the season, we've just finished asking you to fill out a pledge card for the next year. We (I!) could have done more to follow up. But ask we must, because just like you, our leadership knows the weight of cost and the press of the calendar. We've had turnover in the finance staff, and it has slipped, so just like you, we're staring at a new year, at the reality of money to be spent, and we're counting the cost. **That's the shameless plug of this article—IF YOU HAVEN'T TURNED IN A PLEDGE CARD, PLEASE DO SO!**

That said, *counting the cost is something Jesus knew well*. If deadweight is the loss to one person that isn't gained by another, how do we view what Jesus did for us on the Cross? Paul explained that very concept to the church in Philippi, when he encouraged them with these words:

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. -Philippians 2:3-8

Jesus, the one whose coming we remember and anticipate, gave up heaven to be born in a manger for us. Jesus, the one whose death bought us life, gave up his right as King of all to die on a cross for us. My friends, let the economists argue about what will happen tomorrow or a year from now. Let others get consumed by the consumerism of a secular Christmas. Whether it is through much or in little, in giving to a loved one or to a beloved church, may this Advent remind us first to have the mind of Christ. What he lost was hardly deadweight, for his loss was multiplied beyond comprehension.

You know your finances. You know the weight of cost. It feels like it's about money, but it isn't. My friends, be encouraged, and let God take the pressure and bear the weight. We often say, "it's the thought that counts," but that isn't exactly true—it's the humility that counts. Whatever you give, to each other, to the church, to someone you've never met—do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. That is the real cost of Christmas.


