

# Small Group Ministry

Small Group Ministry was identified by The Gulf Atlantic Diocese as a key area of growth in the diocesan strategic plan unveiled at Synod in November of 2023. The diocese will focus resources on helping each parish develop a Small Group Ministry.

Why is Small Group Ministry identified as one of the main focal points? Because within a Small Group, all 4 pillars of The St. Peter's Parish Rule of Life can take place in a single ecosystem: Worship & Prayer, Discipleship, Community, and Missions. Small Groups, if intentionally planned, incorporate Bible Study, Fellowship, Prayer, Worship, and Service or Missional Outreach. Small Group Ministry accelerates and enhances the spiritual growth of group members and is essential to our walk. All of us need others to walk with, grow with, pray with, worship with, and learn within smaller settings than only Sunday corporate worship.

For the last 6 or 7 months, a team of clergy, staff, and lay volunteers have been working diligently behind the scenes to help our new and existing Small Group Leaders build and expand the Small Group Ministry here at St. Peters. It took several months to identify the 25 or 30 existing groups already in place. Once identified, we had to understand group demographics (ages, etc.), meeting times, study topics, and group status (full, open, etc.). During that same time, we were praying for new leaders to be raised up, developing training programs and standards, setting goals, and defining the very purpose of the Ministry.

We conducted a Leadership Summit in the Fall to share tactical Small Group Leadership Strategies and Ideas for both existing and potential Small Group Leaders. A month later, we held an Informational Meeting for anyone interested in joining a Small Group. As a result of all these initiatives, we have had 6 new Small Groups kick off in the last month with 40-50 new group members!

St. Peter's now has almost 40 small groups in place—serving men, women, couples, singles, young families, and youth. Being connected in a small group is so significant—especially in a church the size of St. Peter's.

### **CATHEDRAL TOUR**

Saturday, 13 January | 10-11AM | No doubt many of you have attended numerous services and admired the beauty of the cathedral—have you considered taking a tour? Tours are given on the second Saturday of each month at 10AM.

You can learn about the symbolism of the West end of the building, the architectural details of the spires and crosses, why the construction took 2 years instead of 200, why the older cathedrals took hundreds of years to build, learn about the narthex, why the baptismal font is almost always at the west end, why the floor is supported by the prayers of the people, why the pews are the most expensive wood you will ever sit on, symbolism of the poppyheads on the ends of the pew, symbolism of the nave, roof, and roof support system, how and why Robert Mullins made the crucifix, learn about symbolism of the alter, Pulpit, Tester over the pulpit, and Lecturn, learn about the statues and reredos made by Granda Liturgical in Spain, the stained glass windows made by Wipple Glass in Britain, how the stain glass windows are protected, the stations of the cross, the Cathedral organ and why the pulpit has a trap door.

So, consider taking a tour and learning everything you would like to know about your Cathedral.
