
Colossians 1: 9-20



The Exhortation

Celebrant:

Dearly beloved, the Scripture teacheth us that we were all dead in our sins and trespasses, but by grace we may be saved through faith. Our Savior Jesus Christ saith, "Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God"; and he commissioned the Church to "teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost." Here we ask our heavenly Father that this Candidate, being baptized with water, may be filled with the Holy Ghost, born again, and received into the Church as a living member of Christ's body. Therefore, I beseech you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his abundant mercy he will grant to this Candidate that which by nature he cannot have.

The Presentation of the Candidates

Celebrant: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Presenters: I present Stratton Christopher to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Infants and Younger Children

Celebrant: Today, on behalf of this child, you shall make vows to renounce the devil and all

his works, to trust God wholeheartedly, and to serve him faithfully. It is your task to see that this child is taught, as soon as he is able to learn, the meaning of all these vows, and of the Faith that you will profess as revealed in the Holy Scriptures. He must come to put his faith in Jesus Christ, and learn the Creeds, the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and all other things that a Christian ought to know, believe, and do for the welfare of his soul. When he has embraced all these, he is to come to the Bishop to be confirmed, that he may publicly claim the Faith for his own and be further strengthened by the Holy Spirit to serve Christ and his kingdom. Are you willing and ready to undertake this?

Presenters: I am, the Lord being my helper.

Profession of Faith

Celebrant: Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel

against God?

Presenters: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that

corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Presenters: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of

God?

Presenters: I renounce them.

The Celebrant prays over the Candidate and anoints him with the Oil of Exorcism, saying:

Celebrant: Almighty God deliver thee from the powers of darkness and evil, and lead thee into

the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

The Celebrant continues:

Celebrant: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

Presenters: I do.

Celebrant: Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of

the Old and New Testaments?

Presenters: I do.

Celebrant: Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in

them all the days of your life?

Presenters: I will, the Lord being my helper.

The Celebrant addresses the congregation:

Celebrant: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in

his life in Christ?

People: We Will.

Celebrant: Let us join with the parents and godparents to proclaim our faith in the words

of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed.

The Baptismal Covenant

Celebrant: Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

People: I do.

I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Celebrant: Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

People: I do.

I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

Celebrant: Do you believe and trust in the Holy Ghost?

People: I do.

I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Litany for the Candidate

Led by the child's father

Lector: Let us now pray for this Candidate who is to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Lector: That this child may come to confess their faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Lector: That he may continue in the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, in the breaking

of bread, and in the prayers.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Lector: That he may walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which he has been called,

ever growing in faith and all heavenly virtues.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Lector: That he may persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever he falls into sin, repent and

return to the Lord.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Lector: That he may proclaim by word and deed the Good News of God in Christ Jesus

to a lost and broken world.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Lector: That as a living member of the Body of Christ, he may grow up in every way into

him who is the head.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Lector: That, looking to Jesus, he may run with endurance the race set before him, and at

the last receive the unfading crown of glory.

People: We beseech thee to hear us, Good Lord.

Prayer for the Candidate

Celebrant: Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting Father, who of thy great mercy didst save Noah and his family in the ark from perishing by water, thereby prefiguring the Sacrament of Holy Baptism; We beseech thee, for thine infinite mercies, that thou wilt mercifully look upon this thy servant. Wash him and sanctify him with the Holy Ghost, that he, being delivered from thy wrath, may be received into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity, may so pass the waves of this troublesome world, that finally he may come to the land of everlasting life, there to reign with thee world without end; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Lord be with you. *Celebrant:* People: And with thy spirit.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up unto the Lord. People:

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: It is meet and right so to do.

Celebrant: We thank thee, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved

in the beginning of creation; through it thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise, and in it thy Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan when the Holy Spirit descended upon

him as a dove.

We thank thee, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are made regenerate by the Holy Ghost. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the

Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Celebrant: Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of thy Holy Spirit, and grant that

> all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue for ever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior; to whom, with thee, in

the unity of the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. AMEN.

The Baptism

The Priest pours water on the head of the candidate, saying,

Celebrant: I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy

Ghost. AMEN.

The Celebrant makes the sign of the Cross upon the forehead of the newly baptized, saying

Celebrant: Receive the sign of the Cross as a token of thy new life in Christ, in which thou

shalt not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, to fight bravely under his banner against the world, the flesh, and the devil, and to continue

Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto thy life's end. AMEN.

When all have been baptized and signed the Celebrant says

Celebrant: Heavenly Father, we thank thee that by water and the Holy Ghost thou hast

bestowed upon this thy servant the forgiveness of sin, received him as thine own child by adoption, made him a member of thy holy Church, and raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit, that he may

enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.







By the Holy Ghost and the Virgin Mary, he became flesh and dwelt among us. Sanctify them, we beseech thee, by thy Word and Holy Spirit, that they may be for thy people the Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under thy Christ, and bring us with all thy saints into the joy of thy heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through thy Son Jesus Christ: By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world with- out end. **AMEN.**

The Lord's Prayer

Celebrant: And now as our Savior Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Celebrant: Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People: Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

The Prayer of Humble Access

Celebrant and People:

We do not presume to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table; but thou art the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

Communion Instructions

All baptized Christians, regardless of denomination, are welcome to receive the real and living presence of Christ in this Holy Communion. Anyone may come forward for a blessing in lieu of Communion.


Please indicate your desire for a blessing by crossing your arms on your chest.

An usher will release the aisles to come forward for Communion. A verger will direct you to the altar rail where a priest will place a wafer in your hands. If you would like to dip the wafer into the wine, hold it so it is visible and the first chalice bearer will offer you the intinction chalice for you to do so. If you would like to drink from the common cup, consume the bread and drink from the chalice offered by the second chalice bearer.

Gluten-free wafers are available from the acolytes in front of the pulpit or the lectern. Once you have obtained your wafer, come to the priest for the words of administration.
