

PATHWAYS TO DISCIPLESHIP

In order to foster discipleship within St. Peter's, the Adult Discipleship Committee has developed a system for labeling all classes in terms of how each supports our Fourth Pathways to Mature Discipleship. As you register for class this spring, please note how each class has been labeled.

THE FOUR PATHWAYS TO MATURE DISCIPLESHIP

PATHWAY 1 | Formation Through Prayer and Worship: Discipleship is sustained by an intentional life of prayer and worship.

PATHWAY 2 | Formation Through Scripture and Christian Doctrine: Discipleship is sustained by the study of Holy Scripture and by reflection on Christian doctrine.

PATHWAY 3 | Formation Through the Stewardship of Spiritual Gifts and Financial Resources: Discipleship is sustained using our spiritual gifts to serve Christ and through our practice of generosity.

PATHWAY 4 | Formation Through Living Out Our Baptism as Public Witnesses For Christ: Discipleship is sustained as we live out the priestly ministry we received in our baptism, which involves being servants and evangelists.

THE GRAND SWEEP OF SCRIPTURE

January 14-April 28, 10:30-11AM Led by Fr. Michael Petty | Pathway 2

Adult Sunday School continues a journey through the whole of Scripture by exploring the book of Joshua. In Joshua, God's promise of land to the descendants of Abraham finds a provisional fulfillment as Israel settles in the land of Canaan. As we explore the narrative of Joshua, we will be looking at its Christian meaning, recognizing that the early church read this book as prefiguring the Messiah. We will also explore the themes of faith, trust in God, living in a hostile environment, and hope.

The One Faith One Family Sunday School class is an opportunity for Children to learn about Anglican traditions and what it means to be a part of the church family. This wonderful program culminates with a Festal Eucharist (First Communion for some) at the end of the Spring Semester. Recommended to be a two-year program for $1^{\rm st}$ & $2^{\rm nd}$ graders but open to older children who are new to the Anglican faith.

PRAYER BOOK 101

January 22–February 26, 6:15–7:45PM Led by Fr. Michael Petty | Pathways 1 & 4

Prayer Book 101 is an introduction to The Book of Common Prayer, 2019 which is the official prayer book of the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA). This class focuses on how to use the Prayer Book for both common and private prayer and is a good introduction to liturgical worship for those who do not come from a liturgical tradition. Topics include: The Daily Office (Morning and Evening Prayer), the foundations of liturgical worship, the theology of the sacraments, the two eucharistic liturgies (Anglican Standard and Ancient Renewed), liturgies for Holy Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Matrimony and other pastoral rites, the Church liturgical calendar and major feast days. Participants should purchase a copy of The Book of Common Prayer, 2019, available in St. Peter's Bookstore. A Walk Through the Prayer Book by Arnold Klukas is also recommended.

THE DEAD THEOLOGIANS SOCIETY

As the name implies, the Dead Theologians Society meets to discuss the works of theologians who are physically dead but whose works and influence are still very much with us in the Church. By reading and reflecting upon the works of these figures, we gain insight into the Christian faith and wisdom for facing today's challenges. The group has read and discussed the works of such theologians as Karl Barth, John Wesley, St. Athanasius, Hans Urs von Balthasar, and St. Thomas Aquinas. The group's current book is *The Great Divorce* by C. S. Lewis.

STRUGGLES IN THE SPIRITUAL LIFE

Led by Fr. Sudduth Cummings & Brian Bailey | Pathways 1 & 4

All of us encounter spiritual struggles, valleys in our journey with the Lord, and times of spiritual dryness or even desolation. This class focuses on particular struggles and how to deal with them so as to grow in holiness. Some of the situations addressed will be: What to do when you are tired, burned out, or overwhelmed by life. How to respond when you feel burdened or confused in prayer. Helpful tactics to employ when experiencing spiritual struggles. How to deal with worldly agitations and temptations. How to resist the enemy when your confidence in God is threatened. Participants should purchase Struggles in the Spiritual Life: Their Nature and Their Remedies by Timothy Gallagher, available in St. Peter's Bookstore.

MERE CHRISTIANITY

Led by Deacon Justin Hughes | Pathways 2 & 4

In <u>Mere Christianity</u>, C. S. Lewis lays out the fundamentals of the Christian faith and doctrine in a way that is both accessible to the novice and engaging for the mature. It is among the 20th Century's most important contributions to the canon of classic works of Christian thought. This class will read and discuss Mere Christianity and bring it into conversation with biblical texts and other classic expressions of Christian faith and doctrine. The issues Lewis addresses are a great read for people new to or interested in the Christian faith. Participants should purchase a copy of <u>Mere Christianity</u> by C. S. Lewis, available in St. Peter's Bookstore.

GROWING A CULTURE OF INTERCESSION AND HEALING PRAYER IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

Led by Bp. Andy Miller & Curate Ryan Cecil | Pathways 1 & 4

Intercession and Healing Prayer have been critical components of faith expressed by both the Old and New Testaments and have historically been central to the life, mission, and health of the Church. This class will emphasize the importance of creating a foundation for and nurturing a culture of intercession and healing prayer. Special attention will be given to scriptural lessons and instruction on intercession and healing prayer for "sickness of body, mind, and spirit" (BCP, p. 225), as taught and demonstrated by Christ, the patriarchs, and the Apostles. In addition to these principles, participants will also explore five ways that believers typically hear from God so that we are able to pray in agreement with the intercession of the Holy Spirit.
