World Mission Sunday is celebrated each year in the Anglican Church in North America on the second to last Sunday of Epiphany. Epiphany means 'manifestation' and includes the manifestation of Christ to the Magi. The Magi were the first to follow the light and find Christ. On this World Mission Sunday, we are reminded that we are called to be the light of the world and to use that light to spread hope to those who are vulnerable and/or marginalized. As Jesus taught us,

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on a stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."—MATTHEW 5:14-16

Have you wondered what God's plan is for you and where you should use your unique talents? Do you feel something is missing in the way you currently serve or don't serve? World Mission Sunday is your chance to find a way to show Christ's love to others who may not be like us. We are all called to serve and care for others.
